

Ornamental Fish Update – Important Information Regarding Pest Fish

July 2017

On 16 December 2016, NSW government introduced further changes to the NSW Pest Fish List as part of a consistent approach to the management of ornamental fish throughout Australia. The NSW Pest Fish List now includes an additional 65 listings that have been nationally agreed as having a high-risk potential.

Why are there changes to the pest fish list?

In 2006, all Australian governments, in consultation with representatives of the ornamental fish industry, developed a National Strategy called the 'A Strategic Approach to the Management of Ornamental Fish in Australia'. The National Strategy contains seven recommendations for the management of ornamental fish in Australia, including the development of an agreed National Pest Fish List.

Pest fish possess characteristics that have the potential to trigger, or contribute to, aquatic pest or disease outbreaks, impacting upon natural biodiversity and fisheries resources. Weatherloach and Tilapia are two examples of pest species which, when released, are known to have impacts on our natural aquatic systems. The National Strategy aims to reduce the occurrence of similar invasions in the future.

The complete NSW Pest Fish List is presented inside this brochure. Please note that a six month advisory period for **new additions** to the list – indicated by an asterix (*) and highlighted in **bold type** on an orange background – commenced on 1 March 2017. The advisory period ends on 1 September 2017 and compliance for the newly listed species will be enforced from this date. Compliance with all other species is already mandatory by law.

What rules apply to the newly listed pest fish?

All pest fish listed as prohibited matter in [Schedule 2 of Biosecurity Act 2015](#) are prohibited for sale and possession. Additional pest fish listed in the

part 2, schedule 1 of the Biosecurity Regulation 2017, are subject to notification and must not be dealt with. Compliance with the NSW Pest Fish List is mandatory by law.

What should I do with any pest fish that I have?

A number of ornamental fish species that were previously traded by the aquarium industry, aquarium enthusiasts or hobbyists are now prohibited from being sold and/or being in your possession.

However, NSW DPI is providing a six month advisory period, which commenced on 1 March 2017 to provide time for advisory materials to be distributed and ornamental fish owners to comply with the new additions to the NSW pest fish list

Note: advisory period is ONLY for the new listings, indicated by an asterisk (*) and highlighted in **bold type** on an **orange** background in the tables inside this brochure.

The advisory period ends on 1 September 2017 and compliance for the newly listed species will be enforced from this date.

Ornamental fish owners are required to destroy any pest fish they have using suitable humane methods as advised by the Animal Biosecurity and Welfare Branch of NSW DPI. Approved methods are percussive stunning and ice slurry. Find [welfare of fish](#) at www.dpi.nsw.gov.au for more information. Pest fish should then be disposed of by burying away from any water source, or in a secure disposal unit.

Note: Release of these fish into our waterways is illegal and poses a significant risk to or native species and environments.

As part of the National Strategy the assessment of a number of species is continuing. Following this assessment, it is likely that additional species will be added to the National Noxious Fish List and be declared Pest Fish in NSW.

The advisory date ends on 1 September 2017 and compliance for the newly listed species will be enforced from this date
